Units	Les nombres a 40	Les mois de l'année et les Anniversaires	A Mon Avis
<b>Key Question</b>	Can I read a few familiar French words so that I am ready to pronounce new words with the same sound patterns?		
<b>Essential understanding</b>	Listen more attentively and for longer. Understand more of what we hear even when some of the language may be unfamiliar by using the decoding skills we have developed. Communicate on a wider range of topics and themes. Remember and recall a range of vocabulary with increased knowledge, confidence and spontaneity.	Understand longer passages in French and start to decode meaning of unknown words using cognates and context. Increase our knowledge of phonemes and letter strings using knowledge learnt from units taught.	Write a paragraph using familiar language incorporating connectives/conjunctions, a negative response and adjectival agreement where required. Learn to manipulate the language and be able to substitute words for suitable alternatives. E.g. building on Y3 and Y4 written work.
<b>Skills</b>	Understand the main points from a short spoken passage made up of familiar language	Ask and answer simple questions and talk about interests Understand the main points form a short written text in clear printed script	Write a few short sentences with support, using expressions which I have already learnt
<b>Assessment</b>	Can I count to 40 in French?	Can I say the date in French?	Can I give a simple opinion in French?
	Dictate a selection of numbers up to 40 for children to write down which could include telephone numbers.NB In France telephone numbers are read as 2 digit numbers e.g.32 rather than 3 and 2	Picture and word matching activity.	Given a cut up conversation asking opinions about pets, children to reassemble to correct order e.g. Aimes-tu les chats?
<b>WTS</b>	Children achieve less than 10 out of 10 for numbers to 30	Children can recognise up to 6 French months and combine with numbers up to 20 to form dates.	Children can reassemble short section which includes one question and an answer.

<b>EXS</b>	Children are 100% accurate for numbers to 30	Children can recognise French more than 6 months and combine with numbers to form dates.	Children can reassemble with at least two question and answer and a wider range of verbs such as j'adore, je déteste, j'aime.
<b>GDS</b>	Children are 90% accurate for all numbers up to 40	Children can recognise all French months and combine with numbers to form dates.	Children can reassemble three or more questions, one of which uses the negative correctly i.e. je n'aime pas les chiens.
